It is time again to participate in our church wide study. As the season after the Epiphany comes to a close and Lent begins we are going to follow John Ortberg's six week study *If You Want to Walk on Water, You've Got to Get Out of the Boat*. The focus of this study is on learning to trust God.

The book jacket has this to say,

Deep within you lies the same faith and longing that sent Peter walking across the wind-swept Sea of Galilee toward Jesus.

In what ways is the Lord telling you, as he did Peter, "Come"?

John Ortberg invites you to consider the incredible potential that awaits you outside your comfort zone. Out on the risky waters of faith, Jesus is waiting to meet you in ways that will change you forever, deepening your character and your trust in God. The experience is terrifying. It's thrilling beyond belief. It's everything you'd expect of someone worthy to be called Lord.

The choice is yours to know him as only a water-walker can, aligning yourself with God's purpose for your life in the process. There's just one requirement: If You Want to Walk on Water, You've Got to Get Out of the Boat.

It is my hope that we will once again participate in small groups to discuss our learnings and the sermons will also coincide with the study. Our schedule for worship with be . . .

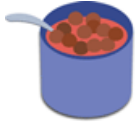

John Dromazos and the 22 singers include some members of the Chi Rho Singers and additional voices from throughout the conference. Light refreshments will follow the program.

Youth Summer Mission Trip



The Youth are hitting the road again this summer. This time we will be heading to Kentucky on July 22nd for a mission trip sponsored by the Conference's Young People's Ministry Council. Our youth will be joining youth from around the Susquehanna Conference for a week long mission trip at the Henderson Settlement.

The Henderson Settlement is located in Frakes and is a Mission Agency within the Red Bird Methodist Missionary Conference. A Missionary Conference is located in an area that cannot support itself and receives most of its funding from the Methodist General Conference. Frakes is located in Bell County, in the heart of the eastern Kentucky coal region. Bell County is an area of rugged mountains, beautiful lakes, swift flowing streams, and extreme poverty. Unemployment is above 50%. There is a large school drop-out rate and a high number of disabled individuals.

The Henderson Settlement offers programs and services to the community. The Youth will be spending the week working either at the Henderson mission or helping to fix up homes in the community.

The cost of the trip is \$225 each. The conference will be covering the cost of our travel to Kentucky. It is my hope that the youth will raise all of their money to go on the trip. Currently we have 14 youth interested in participating in the mission trip, which would make the cost \$3150. The Youth have been fundraising all year for a mission trip and currently have raised \$2248 towards their trip. So they have \$902 left to raise. At this point I do not have all the details of the trip, so I don't know how long the youth have to raise this money.

It is not too late to join us on the mission trip, see me for details! We will be having a parents meeting as soon as I have some more details from the conference.

The youth will be having more fundraisers in the upcoming months. Look for another Murder Mystery Dinner in April. We hope you will join us for dinner and a game of "who done it" as the youth act out a murder mystery before your eyes.

Please keep the youth group in your prayers as we plan for this trip and continue to raise the money.
