My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The words of Jesus about the end times continue to ring true for our generation: there are wars and rumors of wars; there is lawlessness (especially among lawmakers and others with power and privilege); the love of most people has grown cold; and the persecution of the Church has reached into the heartland of our nation. The values of the society in which we live have denigrated so drastically that evil no longer surprises us. Certainly, this is the case for moral evil, as mass shootings, corruption of power, and the opioid epidemic have lulled the hearts of many into bitterness. Couple moral evil with natural evil, as repeated hurricanes and other natural disasters continue ravaging our planet, and it's not hard to see the death of hope.

Our world is so very broken, but as Christians we do not belong to the world: we may be *in* the world but we are no longer *of* the world.

The season of Advent is upon us – a season in which we celebrate the promises of hope, peace, joy and love – as again we make our way to the manger. We don't celebrate these promises of faith as though they aren't present, for the truth of the manger is that God is with us...that God's Word was made flesh in Jesus.

Jesus was born into our broken world, to be broken by our world, for the sake of redeeming our broken world.

The Apostle Paul reminds us that we are only going to find the encouragement we need to endure our present brokenness, if we are looking to God's Word through the power of His Holy Spirit.

My prayer for the Church this Advent and Christmastide is that we make hope alive for those who think hope is dead.

*"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." - Romans 15:13*

May the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love of Jesus be upon you and working through you this Holy Season.

## Global Young People's Convocation

Hello,

My name is Hannah Carter. I am in 11<sup>th</sup> grade at Selinsgrove High School. I am excited to share with you, that I have been chosen to participate in the Global Young People's Convocation. I was elected by a panel of my peers from the Northeast Jurisdiction to be one of five voting youth on the delegation. We will be voting on proposals that directly influence the young people of the United Methodist Church. These proposals will be presented at the United Methodist General Conference, which will meet again in 2020.

The GYPC will be taking place in Johannesburg, South Africa in July 2018. In order to attend the GYPC **I need to raise \$3500**. The Northeast Jurisdiction will be paying for my registration fees of \$899. I still need to raise funds for my room and board, and my flight. The first deposit due for the trip will be on November 15. **So far, I have raised around \$2700**. I am having a pancake breakfast on December 2<sup>nd</sup> see announcement in this newsletter for more information.

I am asking my church family for help in raising these funds. If you would like to help, you may make your contribution through CCUMC so that it is a tax-deductible contribution. Barb and Pam will see that I receive your contribution.

## Youth Summer Mission Trip



The Youth are hitting the road again this summer. This time we will be heading back to Kentucky on June 9<sup>th</sup> for a weeklong mission trip at the Henderson Settlement.

The Henderson Settlement is located in Frakes, KY and is a Mission Agency within the Red Bird Methodist Missionary Conference. A Missionary Conference is located in an area that cannot support itself and receives most of its funding from the Methodist General Conference. Frakes is located in Bell County, where the unemployment is above 50%.

The Henderson Settlement offers programs and services to the community. Last year we spent the week working at the settlement. We are hoping this year to be able to do some projects in the community as well.

The cost of the trip is \$300 each for their stay at the settlement. We will also need to pay for any of the supplies for the work projects we will pick to do. We will do that in February/March. We will be raising enough to cover half of each of the youth's trips and the cost of our building supplies. Currently we have 18 youth interested in participating in the mission trip.

It is not too late to join us on the mission trip, see me for details!

The youth will be having fundraisers in the upcoming months. The youth will be gift wrapping at the Bon-ton during the month of December. You will find them at a table in the store on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> or 16<sup>th</sup> from 3pm-6pm. They will be wrapping gifts for a donation towards their mission trip. We will be having our penny march on Dec. 17<sup>th</sup>. We will also be selling Hoagies for Super bowl Sunday coming up in February.

Please keep the youth group in your prayers as we plan for this trip and continue to raise the money.
